Attendance

Attendance continues to be monitored over the weeks and terms. Where attendance has dropped for individual children, letters have been sent out in the Spring term to inform parents that attendance is being monitored for their children.

The government National attendance expectation is **96%**.

Teaching and Learning

Teaching and Learning has continued to be driven by the Emmaus long and medium-term plans. These continue to be developed and used to ensure that there is knowledge and progression within the curriculum. Regular staff training ensures that the intent of each subject area is clearly shared with the children and that the children are given the opportunity to know more and remember more. For phonics, Little Wandle is continuing to be used with staff accessing on-going training. All staff have accessed the training modules to support their delivery of the scheme. This includes Fluency and Y2 spelling training which is new for this academic year.
